5. PUB LIC FORUM – Ray Brusatori addressed the Council regarding his sewer bill and requested that he pay the agreement amount on record with the City.
6. CONSENT AGENDA – Bragstad moved, 2nd by Sherrill approved unanimously. Regarding sewer plant operation, it was suggested that a water pump replace the sewer pump to reduce costs.

8. ORDINANCES AND PUBLIC HEARING
 - Ordinance #184 – Sewer rate increase – Robinson moved, 2nd by Bragstad, approved unanimously
9. ADMINISTRATIVE AGENDA
 - a. ACTC Grant & Sales Tax Proposal – State of California imposing .25% sales tax minimum of \$200,000 per year. Tourists will pay in Amador City - \$1.7 million for 10 years. Has to be on ballot – could help in providing additional parking in Amador City.
 - b. Cemetery Committee Report & City Finance Request – Chairperson, A’laina Lyons, of the Cemetery Committee made a presentation citing need for attention to vegetation management including iris beds and trees, new information and name signs. She recommended annual budget of \$1,000 for general maintenance which includes weed control. She also discussed possible irrigation. To reduce liability in cemetery CIRA may have \$3,500 available for safety improvements. A request to CIRA for \$3,500 to address urgent need category was moved by Robinson and 2nd by Sherrill, approved unanimously. This will be item on new budget to be on July agenda.

- c. Park Update – City Hall – A community project. An ACRA landscaper may be available. \$79,000 of fees to be reimbursed from Weber, Ghio & Assoc.
 - d. Fire Up-date – Lead abatement, waiting to hear from insurance adjuster
 - e. (c on agenda) RMRA projects – Resolution #615 SB1 money – Staples moved, 2nd by Robinson, approved unanimously
 - f. (d on agenda) Animal Services – We are required to provide animal services, Animal Control has annual budget of \$60,000 in revenues.

Hi Everyone,

ACTC has begun the process to update the Regional Transportation Plan - we anticipate adoption sometime in 2024. The RTP Update will emphasize revised policies that focus on:

- 1) Maintenance of the Existing System,
- 2) Improved Efficiency and Common Sense Planning
- 3) Improve Safety & Reduce Congestion

The attached Draft Project Listing has already undergone significant changes, primarily in response to the 1st and 2nd Goals. All State Highway projects have been removed from the Tier I (Funded) list. The proposed Tier I list is designed to only contain regionally-significant off-highway, local road projects.

Tier II contains all local projects from the prior plan that will have no regional funding eligibility.

Tier III contains all State Highway projects now to be scheduled as Caltrans SHOPP Candidate projects.

We are asking for your review of the project list. We encourage the scope of your review to cover two points below:

- * Review and recommend projects for the Regional Project List (Funded)
- * Review and revise (as necessary) project scope and cost

We have set an internal deadline of September 20th for this work. Please contact Felicia or myself with any questions or concerns. We are happy to walk you through the process ahead of us.

A Resolution Establishing the Sewer Rate for the Amador Hotel

WHEREAS, in 2022, after commissioning and approving a wastewater rate study pursuant to California Prop. 218 (California Constitution Article XIIIID), the City increased its Equivalent Single Family Residential (ESFR) rates for sewer service within the City to \$91.47; and

WHEREAS, the Amador Hotel contains both multi-family units and commercial units served by a single sewer connection. As such, the Amador Hotel is considered to be a “Special Unit.” Per Article 8, Chapter 13.04.710 of the Amador City Municipal Code, rates for Special Units are based on the load placed on the Amador City sewer system, which is determined by winter water usage, and are established by a resolution of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, in January 2013, the owner of the Amador Hotel, Mr. Ray Brusatori, filed a lawsuit in the Amador Superior Court, Case No. 13-CV-8193, which was settled in May 2013 pursuant to a written agreement between the City and Mr. Brusatori. Per this agreement, Mr. Brusatori was charged for one (1) Commercial at 100% and seven (7) Multi-family units at 55%. Since the initial 2013 agreement, Mr. Brusatori added another apartment to the Amador Hotel. When this happened, Mr. Brusatori was charged an additional multi-family unit for a total of eight (8) at 55%. As a result, the sewer bill for the Amador Hotel equaled 5.4 times the ESFR rate, a.k.a. a 5.4 “multiplier”; and

WHEREAS, load on the Amador City sewer system is typically determined by average daily winter water usage, and the Amador Hotel’s average winter water usage in 2023 was .63 units daily or 19 units monthly.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, in consideration of the aforementioned, the sewer rates for the Amador Hotel shall be as follows:

WHEREAS, Amador City has considered the benefits of requiring certain material(s), product(s), thing(s), or service(s) to be specified for use in its Construction Program; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Public Contract Code section 3400 (“PCC §3400”), Amador City intended to specifically list and/or designate in its invitation to bid or requests for proposals, certain material(s), product(s), thing(s), or service(s) identified by Amador City or it’s affiliates; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2023, at 10:00 am Amador City opened a single bid received from Wunschel & Sons. The bid not only exceeded the Engineers Estimate of \$124,546.00, but also the park grant of \$175,000.00; and

WHEREAS, on April 20, 2023, at 10:00 am the City opened a single bid received from for J. vila Builders, LLC. The bid not only exceeded the Engineers Estimate of \$124,546.00, but also the park grant of \$175,000.00; and

WHEREAS, on March 22, 2023, and June 1, 2023, in accordance with PCC §3400, each respective bid was rejected by formal letter; and

WHEREAS, Any purchases, procurements, or projects which exceeds \$5,000.00 generally requires the Amador City Council to follow the formal bid procedures. However, when the bidding process is followed but results in non-competitive bidding procedures the City may be exempted from the process and may seek sole source authority under the discretion of the City Council in order to complete a specific project subject to grant award timelines or restrictions; and

WHEREAS, Additionally, if the grant award provides for procurement of equipment, supplies, or engineering separate and distinct from the competitive bidding process to complete the project but would become impossible or improbable to complete when the competitive bidding fails to provide the proper contractual relationships with contractors meeting the requirements under the grant; the city should be exempt from the formal bidding procedure since the project requires completion under the awarding grant agreement which allows for sole source approval

exemption. Therefore, the Amador City Hall Park qualifies for exemption from the formal bidding procedures.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Amador City that it hereby approves the Sole Source Agreement process of seeking appropriate sub-contracts for the completion of the Amador City Hall Park project awarded under the Per Capita Grant Program administered under State of California - Natural Resources Agency DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION to be completed in a reasonable time.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to execute the agreements in a form approved by the City Attorney not to exceed the amounts approved under the grant qualifications.


